I find myself in a period of joyful anticipation for new initiatives that Mrs. Stack and I prepared over the summer. We had two goals in mind: reinforce the Catholic identity that has strongly influenced OMC and find ways to permeate the SSJ and Salesian missions throughout the curriculum and culture of the school as much as possible.

With excitement, I share the fruits of that planning: the "Blessed Are We Boot Camp" and the "Live+Jesus Virtue of the Month" Recognition Initiative!

The "Blessed Are We Boot Camp" provides supplemental religious instruction in collaboration with each grade's religion teacher. It is important to ensure that our students have a solid foundation in the basic tenets of the Catholic Faith – a foundation that builds on itself as they progress through each grade. In the course of the Blessed Are We Boot Camp, OMC students will strengthen their knowledge and personal connections to foundational Catholic teachings and traditions, and their relationships with God and the Catholic/Christian Faith.

The "Live+Jesus Virtue of the Month" Recognition Initiative is a campus-wide program that encourages students to focus on and practice a specific virtue every month and be acknowledged publicly at school masses for their efforts. The "Live+Jesus" Initiative was introduced at the start of the school year. Each month, faculty and staff will widely share the selected virtue, its definition, and some examples of living that virtue. I provide a lesson on that virtue and teachers identify one student from their class who exemplified that particular virtue, and those individuals will be acknowledged at the following school mass.

It has been a true privilege to engage in the faith formation of our young learners with these two programs. Students are supportive and proud of their peers when they are recognized for exemplifying each month's virtue, and it is fun to watch the healthy competition and excitement that manifests when they're learning and participating in "bootcamp drills."

It is my hope that these initiatives will become traditions that students look forward to each year, and that will leave a lasting impression as they continue to grow in their faith.

Financial Aid Helps Our Students Thrive

For the 2024-2025 academic year, OMC was fortunate to receive over \$255,000 in financial aid for our students from donors to our Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) and Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) programs.

Pennsylvania's EITC and OSTC programs allow individuals and businesses paying taxes in the state to turn their tax burden into financial aid for students at OMC. Donors who commit to give to OMC through these programs for one year receive a 75% tax credit on their donation or 90% if they commit for two years.

We are proud to partner with the Foundation for Catholic Education (FCE) and Business Leadership Organized for Catholic Schools (BLOCS) to help provide our families with the aid they need to make OMC their school of choice.

OMC's multi-faceted diversity sets us apart and makes us a stronger community. Your contribution to these programs will help to ensure that OMC's unmatched Catholic education remains the best choice for all our families.




OMC Annual Report
